Facilities Highlights

- **OHS and OMS**
Geo-Thermal heating and cooling controls the climate of this 200,000 square foot facility which sits on 80 acres. The newly remodeled 6-12 campus provides classrooms based on a high performance model, with interactive technology, wireless capabilities, and optimal lighting. A state of the art security system and School Resource Officer ensures a safe learning environment. Indoor specialty areas include swimming pool, auditorium, gymnasiums, family consumer science rooms as well as industrial technology and agriculture labs. An all weather track highlights our outdoor facility which includes baseball, soccer, football, and softball fields. In the Spring of 2011, the OMS building addition will be complete, featuring a new special education life skills room.
- **Olympia North**
Constructed in 2009, this school incorporates a learning pod design, interactive technology capabilities, and features energy efficient systems such as Geo-Thermal and natural lighting. It provides security with Post Columbine entry systems and cameras. The new Olympia North sits on 25 acres.
- **Olympia South**
Remodeled in 2009, Olympia South provides a climate controlled environment for students with Geo-Thermal heating and cooling. The learning environment includes a new lab with wireless capabilities. Classrooms are equipped with interactive technology and secured with Post Columbine entry systems and cameras. Plans are underway to remodel the tennis courts by the community of Atlanta.
- **Olympia West**
Remodeled in 2009, Olympia West shines with a newly remodeled learning center with new lab, cafeteria, and instructional spaces. The building is secured with Post Columbine entry systems and cameras.

Financial Recognition

The Illinois State Board of Education placed the Olympia School District in "Financial Recognition" status based on the 2010 School District Profile. This is the highest category obtainable for school districts in Illinois. Olympia has earned this status rating 5 out of the last 6 years.
