

Olympia North

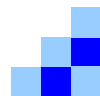

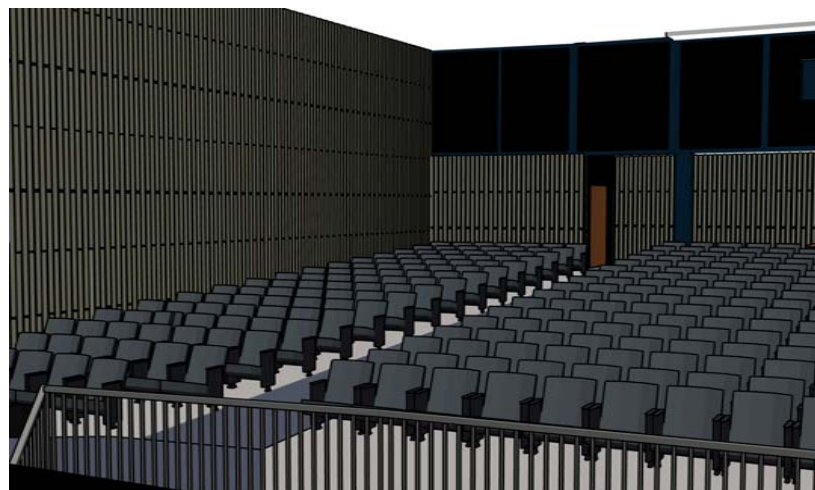
